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



The four titles in the Follow My Food series provide a useful resource for Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 classrooms. The books fit well with various aspects of the Key Stage 1 curriculum, for example:

MILLY COW GIVES MILK

Design & Technology: Cooking and Nutrition

- To use basic principles of a healthy and varied diet to prepare dishes
- To understand where food comes from

SHELLY HEN LAYS EGGS

English: Writing - Composition

- composing a sentence orally before writing it
- sequencing sentences to form short narratives
- listening to and discussing a wide range of poems, stories and nonfiction at a level beyond that at which they can read independently





POLLY BEE MAKES HONEY Science: Animal Survival Needs

- * To observe and make a record of an animal
- To understand that animals and the environment should be treated with care and sensitivity



GRANNY PIP GROWS FRUIT

English: Knowledge and Understanding of the World

- Explore the natural world around them, make observations and draw pictures of animals and plants
- Know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class
- Understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them, including the seasons and changing states of matter.



Some of the books may be used seasonally, eg Summer pollination (POLLY BEE MAKES HONEY); Plant life cycle and the seasons (GRANNY PIP GROWS FRUIT); Spring/Easter (SHELLY HEN LAYS EGGS); Winter/summer farming (MILLY COW GIVES MILK)
