Hello, my name is **Tonka.** I would love to visit your school and tell you about my work as an illustrator and how the book *Elki is Not My Dog* came to be.



As an art educator I deliver creative workshops and storytelling sessions in libraries, schools and in the community. I am one of Cambridge Curiosity and Imagination artist facilitators, and reading champion and storyteller for Talking Together in Cambridgeshire. I have worked with Kettle's Yard gallery, Fitzwilliam Museum, Wisbech Museum, NIE theatre company, and the Flying Carpet Festival in Mardin, Turkey.
